

## Holistic Rural Development Program (HDFC): DM Visit Assam

In a notable event on November **4, 2023, Dr. Neha Yadav**, the District Collector of Biswanath, undertook a visit to HRDP project villages. During her tour, Dr. Yadav personally witnessed the transformation of key community spaces, including the school campus, Anganwadi Centre, Digital Library, and Handloom Unit.

The ongoing development at the mini stadium in Badeti TE village also came under her scrutiny.

Engaging actively with villagers and committee members, Dr. Yadav delved into the impactful interventions carried out in these project villages. Mr. Kalyan Sharmah, Branch Manager of HDFC Bank (Biswanath Charali), was present to accompany and provide insights during the visit.









#### Project Unnati (SBI): Workshop on Gender, Health and Financial literacy

Empowering women in Sirmaur and Solan Districts of Himachal Pradesh, the project conducted workshops covering critical topics.

- Gender Sensitivity, enlightening participants on societal structures, patriarchy, and genderrelated rights.
- Health and Hygiene sessions focused on symptoms of a healthy lifestyle, cleanliness, and women's health.
- Legal Rights discussions highlighted equality in law, education, and custody.
- Financial Literacy modules covered savings, loan management, insurance, investments, and government schemes.

These workshops reached a total of 1026 women beneficiaries across 16 Gram Panchayats, fostering knowledge and empowerment in diverse aspects of their lives.















### Gram Seva (SBI): Renovation of Water Sources

The challenge of water scarcity persisted in five villages of Kiri Gram Panchayat, Himachal Pradesh. In response, community members convened a Village Service Committee meeting and proposed renovation of the natural water sources for essential drinking purposes.

Five natural water sources were renovated under the project which not only improved access to clean water but also elevated health standards and hygiene practices. Additionally, it ensured sufficient water for livestock, contributing to their well-being. Notably, the initiative extended its positive impact to agriculture, enhancing farmers' productivity through increased water availability for irrigation.

#### **Climate Footprint**

Sustainable Impact Unleashed: Scaling Climate Solutions Across Uttarakhand, Assam, and Odisha: In the third year of our climate project, we've significantly expanded our reach, identifying and influencing new villages in Uttarakhand, Assam, and Odisha.

A total of **25**, **18**, **and 13 villages** in each state have undergone transformative change through our focused initiatives on climate mitigation technologies such as Biogas, Improved Cook Stoves, and Water Purifiers. The adoption of these technologies by community members has sparked a powerful ripple effect, resonating even in neighboring communities. This collective embrace of innovative solutions not only fortifies the immediate communities but also contributes to their resilience.

Validation and Verification of Climate Footprint Project (Designated Operational Entity DOE Visit): We recently conducted a site visit as part of our Designated Operational Entity (DOE) in four key locations for our Climate Project—Assam, Odisha, Uttarakhand, and Himachal Pradesh. This visit aimed to evaluate and understand the impact of our grassroots interventions within the project's scope.

The visit facilitates the validation and verification of climate activities involving Biogas, Improved Cook Stoves, Plantation, and Water Purifiers. Upon successful completion, we anticipate earning carbon credits, ensuring the credibility and effectiveness of our sustainability initiatives.
